REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING REGISTRATION FORMS IN PERSON IS JULY 10@7PM

ONLINE REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED UNTIL 9AM ON JULY 10, 2025.

LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Fees

Junior and 4-H members memberships are \$2.00.

Adult and senior memberships are \$5.00.

Members are given 6 free exhibits into any of the classes.

Adults are charged an additional \$0.50 each for any exhibits over the complimentary 6.

Youth and 4-H members are not charged for any exhibits over the complimentary 6.

Age levels are as follows: Adult are 16 & up, Junior is 15 & under.

Registration

You must pay membership fee to the St. Andrews - St. Clements Agricultural Society to enter in the Talent Exhibition. Membership forms can be printed or filled out electronically.

Registration forms are required for your exhibits to be accepted. Registration can easily be done online. Fees will be collected at drop off. No late registrations accepted.

Specific times and dates mentioned in this book are subject to change, in which case, changes will be communicated via email.

Online registration opens **May 20, 2025 and closes on July 10, 2025 at 9am.**

In-Person Registration

In-person registration is available on the day of drop-off only on July 10, 2025, from 2pm until 7pm.

Rules about Exhibits

Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and completed within the past two years.

Exhibits must not have previously taken a prize at any St. Andrews St Clements Agricultural Society Exhibition. Any article thus recognized will be *disqualified*.

Only 1 exhibit will be allowed per exhibitor in each class. If there is only one exhibit in a class, it will be at the discretion of the Judge whether the exhibit will receive a placement or any prize.

Tags must be attached to exhibits, either before or at drop-off. Tags must be taped, paper clipped, attached with elastic or pinned securely to the item, with the bottom of the tag folded up to the front, covering the name entirely. Do not staple.

Exhibitors are responsible for entering their exhibit in the proper class. Juniors may enter other classes if the class allows. Please note the separate division for Juniors specifically. Choose accordingly.

Before entering, please refer to the rules and judging standards, as well as those listed under their respective divisions. Judging Standards can be found on the website of Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies. <http://www.mbagsocieties.ca/judging-standards>.

Any exhibitors wishing to advertise their small business alongside their exhibits is permitted to place business cards or 3x5" printout next to their items, **after** judging is complete. The Ag Society is not responsible for the advertisements.

Exhibit Drop-Off

Exhibits must be delivered to the Ag Building in Selkirk Park on **Thursday, July 10, 2025 between 2:00PM and 7:00PM**. Exhibits not received by 7:00PM will not be judged.

The directors will take every precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the exhibition, and should property be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, they will give all the assistance in their power toward recovery of same, but will not accept financial responsibility.

Judging & Prizes

Scoring of points in all classes and sections are as follows:

1st place - 3 points

2nd place - 2 point

3rd place - 1 point

Judging Standards can be found on the website of Manitoba Association of Agricultural Societies. <http://www.mbagsocieties.ca/judging-standards>. The Judges reserve the right to disqualify any article that does not comply with these standards. All winning exhibits will have their tags opened after judging.

Prize money in all divisions and classes are as follows:

1st place - \$3

2nd place - \$2

3rd place - \$1

Additional awards may be available in specific classes.

Judge's decisions are final. Grievances must be made in writing to the Secretary within 7 days after the close of the exhibition. A meeting of the directors will be held, notices of which will be given, to hear and decide any grievances that may have arisen in the awarding of prizes. Any infringement of the rules and regulations will result in the withholding of prizes.

Exhibit Pick Up

Exhibitors are responsible for picking up their own exhibits.

Exhibits may be removed from the Ag Building on **Sunday July 13, 2025 between 6:00PM and 8:00PM**, or **between Monday July 14, 2025 between 4:00PM and 6:00PM**.

Any exhibits not picked up will be discarded or donated. The Ag Society is not responsible for exhibits left after pickup time.

Specific Rules:

All paintings and drawings should be framed or mounted on poster paper, Bristol board, etc.

Identify medium used, e.g., acrylic, pastel, oil, watercolour, etc.

Digital storytelling exhibits must be entered as a video file, via email to homelivingandcrafts@gmail.com.

Digital illustration exhibits must be entered as a printed version provided for display.

Costume Design exhibits may be displayed using mannequins brought by exhibitors or flat on a provided table.

Colouring page options can be found at the back of this book and many other pages are online to choose from. For your exhibit, choose one page from what's available.

Rules for Youth Schoolwork Classes:

Any student may enter a higher-grade class, but not a lower grade. (Exceptions may be made for those requiring accommodations – please contact Talent Exhibition Committee for more info.)

Pre-sketching in pencil is allowed on all exhibits unless otherwise stated.

Paper construction exhibits and models must be fastened securely to a base.

Culinary Department

Specific Rules:

Exhibits must be exhibitor's own work and made from scratch.

Cakes must be removed from their containers.

Baking must be enclosed in clear plastic bags or clear containers.

No plastic wrap or cupcake liners.

Canning & Preserving Divisions Rules:

Jars must be labeled with contents. Labels should be placed on the side of the jar, including year produced. Attach tags with rubber bands.

All exhibits must be made in proper preserving jars, sealed. Canned items must have screw-on ring top. No paraffin wax.

All canned goods entered must be prepared using proper canning practices. Water bath canning is required for high-acid foods, and pressure canning is required for low-acid foods. Oven canned items will not be accepted.

Jars will be opened for judging.

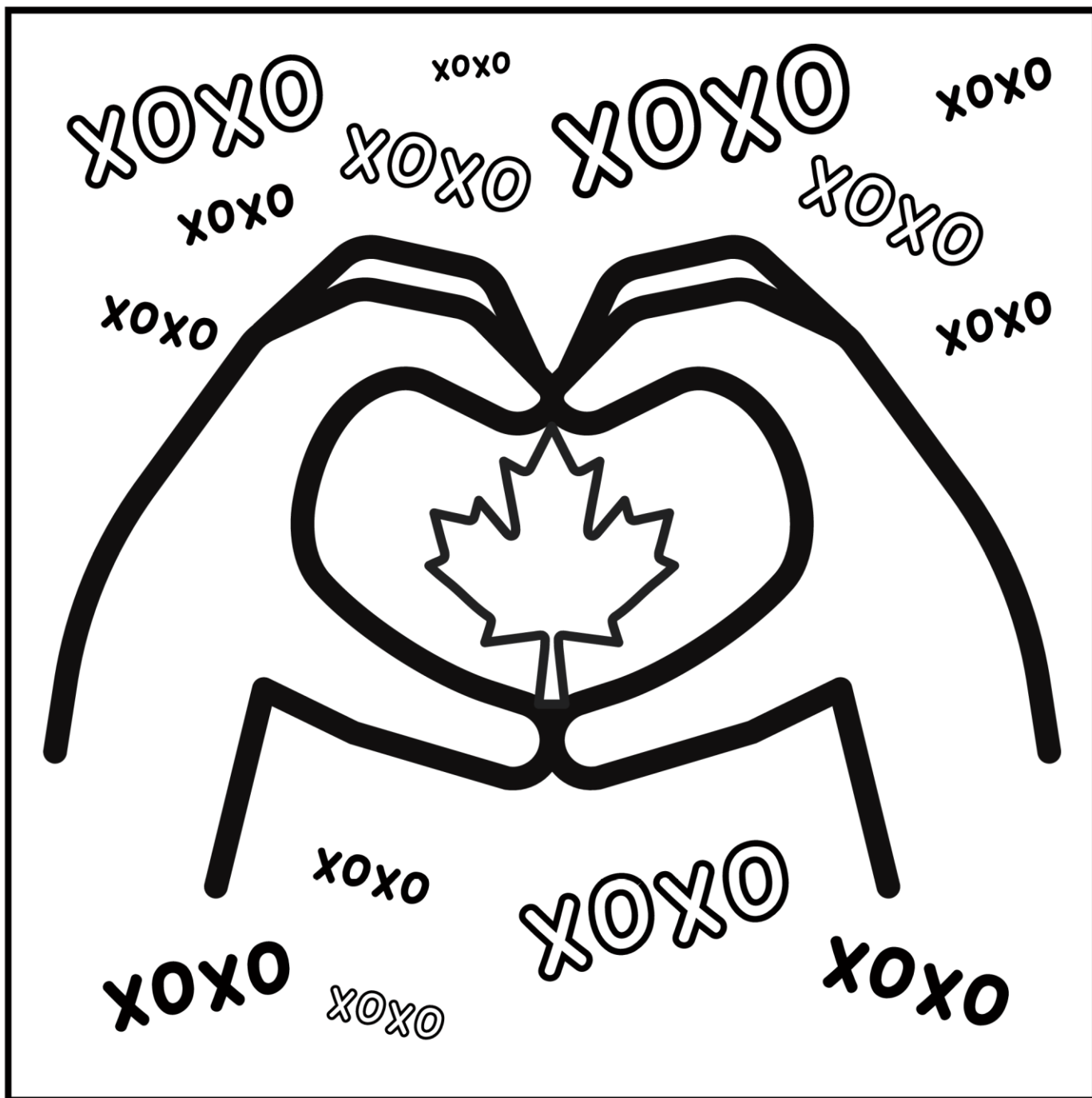
